Terms and Conditions of Membership

Membership of the Ayrshire Sportsability is voluntary with representatives from all organisations and individuals with a remit for or interest in disability sport. Membership is open to all and no application for membership will be refused on other than reasonable grounds. There will be no discrimination on grounds of age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex; sexual orientation, political or other opinion.

Other organisations, or any individual nominated by them, with a remit for the provision and/or development of sport for people with a disability (e.g. national or local disability organisations and sports specific organisations concerned with disability sport).

No more than one individual nominated for membership by any given organisation may be a member of ASA at any one time.

Anyone aged over 16 whose main residence lies within Ayrshire and Arran.

The Management Committee reserve the right to consider each application at the first Committee's meeting that is held after receipt of the application and notify the applicant of their decision within 2 weeks of the meeting.

The Management Committee may invite individuals or organisations who/which share the ASA aims to become members.

A register of members shall be maintained, recording the full name and address of each member, date on which membership was admitted and ceased.

Any person or organisation who/which wishes to withdraw from membership shall inform ASA in writing.

Any person or organisation may be expelled from membership by special resolution passed by 75% or more votes cast at a general meeting, subject to the following procedure:

- At least 21 days' notice of the intention to propose the resolution must be given to the member concerned, specifying the grounds for expulsion;
- The member concerned shall be entitled to be heard on the resolution at the general meeting at which the resolution is proposed.
- There will be a right to appeal. Any applicant rejected must be provided with a justified reason.
